CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS OF THE DEAN DEMOCRATIC CLUB OF SILICON VALLEY

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Article I. Name and Location

The name of this organization is the "Dean Democratic Club of Silicon Valley" ("DDCSV"), an unincorporated, nonprofit association. The location of this organization is Santa Clara County, California, also commonly known as Silicon Valley.

Article II. Origin and Purpose

15 DDCSV was founded as a successor organization to Silicon Valley for Dean, whose 16 participants included persons of various political parties and independents who supported 17 Gov. Howard Dean as the Democratic candidate in the 2004 presidential election. The 18 principal purposes of DDCSV are (i) to inspire grassroots participation in the political 19 process, (ii) to provide a forum for communicating ideas, (iii) to identify and support 20 suitable progressive candidates for elective office, (iv) to research selected ballot initiatives 21 and proposed legislation and strive to inform voters regarding such issues, and (v) to 22 further progressive reform within the Democratic Party, guided by the principles and vision 23 articulated by Gov. Howard Dean. 24

Article III. Affiliation

A. <u>Santa Clara County Democratic Central Committee</u>. DDCSV shall maintain affiliation with the Santa Clara County Democratic Central Committee. As a chartered and affiliated club, DDCSV will comply with the bylaws of the Santa Clara County Democratic Central Committee and the California Democratic Party, as they apply to fully-chartered local affiliates.

B. <u>California Democratic Council</u>. DDCSV shall also maintain an affiliation with the California Democratic Council.

Article IV. Membership and Dues

A. <u>Eligibility</u>. Subject to the satisfaction of all requirements specified in this Article IV, membership in DDCSV is open to all persons regardless of political affiliation (including those under the voting age) who subscribe to DDCSV's policies and purposes and who wish to assist in the advancement of its principles, except that at least twenty (20) members must be registered Democrats.

B. <u>Dues Amount</u>. Membership dues shall be \$15 per year per person and \$25
per family, except that senior citizens age 65 and over and full-time students are eligible for
a reduced rate of \$10 per year. The Steering Committee may adjust dues up or down no
more frequently than once per year, subject to ratification by a majority of the members.

49 C. <u>Payment; Good Standing</u>. Members shall pay a minimum of one year's dues 50 upon initial enrollment and each renewal, and may pay up to an additional one year's dues 51 in advance. Initial membership shall become effective on the date DDCSV receives a

52 member's first dues payment (the "Start Date") and shall end on the date immediately prior 53 to the end of the paid one or two year term, unless renewed. Renewal memberships shall 54 become effective upon the next yearly anniversary of the member's Start Date, provided 55 that DDCSV receives payment no later than thirty (30) days following such anniversary. 56 Members will be provided reasonable notice of the amount and due date for renewal of 57 dues. If DDCSV does not receive a member's payment for a renewal membership within 58 thirty (30) days following the yearly anniversary of the member's Start Date, his or her 59 membership will lapse. A member may cure a lapsed membership and resume good 60 standing by paying outstanding dues in full within one year of the last yearly anniversary of 61 the member's Start Date, which will be retroactive to such last yearly anniversary. If 62 payment is more than one (1) year overdue, membership and good standing will resume 63 effective upon the date dues are paid, which will become the new Start Date for the 64 member. 65

66 Only members whose dues are paid in accordance with the foregoing shall be 67 considered in "good standing" and eligible to hold office and to vote at any meeting of the 68 members of DDCSV, subject to the further limitations specified in Article IV.D below. 69

D. <u>Limitations on Holding Office, Voting</u>. Only members in good standing for not less than six (6) months may qualify to serve on the Steering Committee (discussed further in Article VII below). Only members in good standing for not less than three (3) months may vote on a matter of whether to endorse a candidate for elective office or to declare a position on any ballot initiative or proposed legislation (discussed further in Article XI.A below).

E. <u>Member Information</u>. Each member shall provide his/her full name, residence
 or business address, telephone number and a valid email address (if available). A
 member's information may be shared with other organizations as approved by the Steering
 Committee only with the express consent of such member.

Article V. Member Meetings

A. <u>Organizational Meeting</u>. This Constitution and Bylaws (the "Bylaws"') were duly adopted, and the initial Steering Committee was elected, at the organizational meeting of DDCSV held in June 2004.

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B. Annual and <u>Regular Meetings</u>. A meeting of the members to elect the
Steering Committee and to conduct other business as appropriate will be held each year in
or around June (the "annual meeting"). Additional meetings of the members ("regular
meetings") to conduct DDCSV business (other than election of the Steering Committee) may
be held periodically on dates specified by a Co-Chair of DDCSV.

C. <u>Special Meetings</u>. Special meetings of the members may be called at any
time upon the written request of ten (10) members or ten percent (10%) of the total
membership of DDCSV, whichever is less, delivered to any member of the Steering
Committee.

98 99 D. <u>Notice</u>. All members shall be given notice of the date, time and location of all 100 member meetings, as well as a brief description of the subject matter(s) to be addressed 101 and any matter(s) intended to be voted upon, at least (i) fourteen (14) days in advance for 102 the annual meeting, and (ii) five (5) days in advance for all other member meetings, or

103 such longer period as provided in Article VI.B regarding proposed amendments to these 104 Bylaws. Notice shall be given by electronic mail or, if no email address has been provided, 105 by other practicable means. Notice will also be posted on the official DDCSV Web site. 106 107 E. Procedure; Participation by Non-Members. Member meetings will be 108 conducted in a manner to promote consensus decision-making to the extent reasonably 109 possible. Roberts Rules of Order Newly Revised shall be used to govern parliamentary 110 procedure at all member meetings, except that Roberts Rules of Order may be suspended to 111 conduct emergency business in the discretion of the chair of the meeting. Members not in 112 good standing and other persons, including visitors, may participate in a meeting of the 113 members of DDCSV in the sole discretion of the meeting chair. 114 115 F. Community Gatherings. From time to time DDCSV may sponsor gatherings 116 open to the general community to exchange ideas and share information on topics of 117 common interest. However, no official business of DDCSV may be conducted at such a 118 community gathering. Notice of these events will be posted on the official Web site of 119 DDCSV. 120 121 Article VI. Quorum and Voting Requirements 122 For Member Meetings 123 124 Α. Ouorum. No official action may be taken at any meeting of the members 125 unless a quorum of fifteen percent (15%) of all members or 9 members, whichever is less, 126 is present. In the absence of a quorum, a meeting of the members may be adjourned by 127 the vote of a majority of the members at the meeting, but no other business may be 128 transacted. 129 130 Β. Member Voting; Supermajority Requirements. Each member in good 131 standing (as defined in Article IV.C above) is entitled to one vote. The affirmative vote of a 132 majority of all members present, entitled to vote, and voting at a duly noticed meeting at 133 which a quorum is present is required to pass any resolution or to elect any Steering 134 Committee member, except that a greater number of votes is required as follows: 135 136 1. The affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of all members present, entitled to 137 vote, and voting at a duly noticed meeting at which a quorum is present is 138 required to endorse any candidate for elective office or to declare a position 139 on any ballot initiative or proposed legislation. 140 141 2. The affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of all members present, entitled to 142 vote, and voting at a duly noticed meeting at which a quorum is present is 143 required to amend any provision of these Bylaws. 144 145 No vote on any action requiring greater than a majority vote may be taken unless 146 specific details of the proposed action were provided to members in the notice of meeting. 147 With respect to resolutions to amend these Bylaws, said notice must be given to all 148 members at least thirty (30) days in advance of the meeting and posted on the official Web 149 site of DDCSV. 150 151 C. Proxies. The Steering Committee may adopt procedures to enable members 152 who cannot attend a meeting to cast their vote by proxy. The procedures shall include 153 appropriate safequards to ensure authenticity and protect confidentiality, and shall specify

154 the means for revoking a proxy. 155 156 Article VII. Steering Committee 157 158 Α. Term; Officer Positions. The Steering Committee is elected by the members 159 annually for one-year terms (or until their successors have been elected and qualified) and 160 is responsible for governing DDCSV. The Steering Committee consists of seven (7) officers: 161 two (2) Co-Chairs, who shall be committed to a spirit of collaborative leadership between 162 them, as well as a Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer and two (2) at-163 large officers. In addition, the Steering Committee shall designate one of the Co-Chairs as 164 Assistant Treasurer. 165 166 Β. Eligibility to Hold Office. Any person in attendance at the organizational 167 meeting of the members may be elected to the Steering Committee. Thereafter, only 168 members in good standing (as defined in Article IV.C above) for not less than six (6) 169 months may gualify to serve on the Steering Committee. 170 171 C. Description of Duties. The duties of the officers elected to the Steering 172 Committee are as follows: 173 174 Co-Chairs. The Co-Chairs are responsible for the overall direction of 1 175 DDCSV activities and serve as the spokespersons for DDCSV. One of the Co-Chairs, as 176 agreed to between them, chairs each meeting of the members and of the Steering 177 Committee. In addition, the Co-Chairs are responsible for ensuring that the annual meeting 178 of the members occurs once per year; calling other regular meetings of the members; 179 calling meetings of the Steering Committee; appointing the chair of each standing and ad 180 hoc committee, subject to ratification by the members at the next member meeting; 181 appointing the members of each standing and ad hoc committee in consultation with the 182 respective chair of such committee; representing DDCSV before the Santa Clara County 183 Democratic Committee and California Democratic Council; and collaborating with the other 184 officers in furthering the purposes of DDCSV. In the event that the Treasurer resigns, is 185 removed or is unable to fulfill the remainder of his/her term, the Co-Chair who has been 186 designated as Assistant Treasurer shall immediately assume and carry out the Treasurer's 187 duties until an interim Treasurer is appointed in accordance with Article VIII.D. 188 189 Recording Secretary. The Recording Secretary records and keeps 2. 190 minutes of all meetings of the members and the Steering Committee; conducts balloting for 191 all elections; maintains a current list of all members; maintains copies of reports, 192 correspondence and other writings reflecting the official business of DDCSV; performs such 193 other duties as usually pertain to this office in coordination with the Corresponding 194 Secretary; and collaborates with the other officers in furthering the purposes of DDCSV. 195 196 3. Corresponding Secretary. The Corresponding Secretary sends minutes 197 of member meetings to all members in a timely fashion; sends minutes of Steering 198 Committee meetings to all officers in a timely fashion; sends to all members notices of the 199 meetings of the members, as well as notices of meetings of the Steering Committee and 200 other committees; performs such other duties as usually pertain to this office in 201 coordination with the Recording Secretary; and collaborates with the other officers in 202 furthering the purposes of DDCSV. 203 204 4. Treasurer. The Treasurer maintains all financial records and ac counts

205 of DDCSV in compliance with applicable law; receives and disburses all member dues and 206 other funds of DDCSV, keeping an accurate record of all receipts and disbursements; upon 207 request, provides receipts for all disbursements and a current bank balance reconciliation to 208 at least one Co-Chair for his/her review and approval; deposits all DDCSV funds with a bank 209 or credit union approved by the Steering Committee; reports to each regular meeting of the 210 members the current financial status of DDCSV; files any reports required in accordance 211 with campaign finance or related regulations; performs such other duties as usually pertain 212 to this office; and collaborates with the other officers in furthering the purposes of DDCSV. 213

5. <u>At-Large Officers</u>. The at-large officers will assist the other officers as
 appropriate and collaborate with them in furthering the purposes of DDCSV.

Article VIII. Nominations and Elections of Officers

A. <u>Conduct of Elections</u>. The initial election of officers shall be conducted at the organizational meeting and thereafter at the annual meeting. All contested elections will be determined by secret ballot, while uncontested elections may be by voice vote. If no candidate for a particular office receives a majority vote, a run-off vote will be taken between the top two nominees for that office.

B. <u>Nominating Process</u>. The Nominating Committee will serve as a search committee, encouraging DDCSV members to run for leadership positions within DDCSV. The Nominating Committee will propose a slate of eligible candidates in writing to the members in the notice given for the annual meeting. Further nominations from the floor at the annual meeting may be considered if made and seconded by any two members present and entitled to vote at the meeting.

C. <u>Removal from Office</u>. An officer may be removed from office before the
expiration of his/her term only upon (i) the unanimous vote of all other officers and (ii) the
affirmative vote of a majority of the members of DDCSV.

236 Interim Appointments. If an officer resigns, is removed or is unable to fulfill D. 237 the remainder of the officer's term, the Co-Chairs shall appoint an acting replacement. 238 Such appointments shall be effective until the next annual meeting of the members or until 239 a special meeting of the members is called for the purpose of electing a replacement. At 240 the meeting (i) the acting replacement shall be confirmed by a majority of the members, or 241 (ii) a new replacement shall be elected to fill the remainder of the applicable term, provided 242 that the nomination for the new replacement is made and seconded by any two members 243 present and entitled to vote at the meeting. 244

In the event both Co-Chairs leave office simultaneously and before the end of their terms (or if one leaves without appointing a replacement for the other), the remaining Steering Committee members shall elect new Co-Chairs. Such appointments shall have the effect of any other interim appointment and follow the same post-appointment procedure as above.

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Article IX. Meetings of the Steering Committee

A. <u>Meetings</u>. The Steering Committee may meet in person or by telephone at the discretion of the Co-Chairs or upon request of a Steering Committee member. No official action may be taken at any meeting of the Steering Committee unless a quorum of

256 fifty percent (50%) of all officers is present. In the absence of a quorum, a meeting of the 257 Steering Committee may be adjourned by the vote of a majority of the officers at the 258 meeting, but no other business may be transacted. A report of all actions taken shall be 259 provided at the next meeting of the members. 260 261 Β. Action By Written Consent. The Steering Committee in its discretion may also 262 take action by written consent (including electronic mail) upon agreement by a majority of 263 the Steering Committee members, provided that a report of all such actions is provided at 264 the next meeting of the members. 265 266 **Article X. Other Committees** 267 268 Α. Standing Committees. There shall be five (5) standing committees of DDCSV, 269 entitled Nominating, Endorsement, Fundraising, Membership and Publicity/Media, comprised 270 of club member(s) designated by the Co-Chairs. Except for the Endorsement Committee, 271 there is no required minimum number of committee members. The standing committees 272 are further described as follows: 273 274 A Nominating Committee that is designated by the Co-Chairs prior to 1. 275 the annual meeting of the members and is responsible for nominating suitable officer 276 candidates for the Steering Committee and for recommending suitable appointees to the 277 standing and ad hoc committees of DDCSV. 278 279 An Endorsement Committee, comprised of at least three (3) members, 2. 280 which is responsible for receiving, reviewing, evaluating, and making a recommendation 281 with respect to all requests for endorsement by DDCSV of any candidate for elective office, 282 ballot initiative or proposed legislation and all proposals to make a campaign contribution. 283 284 3. A Fundraising Committee that is responsible for proposing and 285 organizing events or other activities to raise funds to be used to further the purposes of 286 DDCSV. 287 288 4. A Membership Committee that is responsible for developing proposals 289 for and overseeing recruitment of new members and addressing issues related to 290 membership. 291 292 5. A Publicity/Media Committee that is responsible for developing ideas 293 for community outreach, assisting in the drafting of DDCSV's position statements, 294 overseeing the DDCSV Web site, and furthering external communication of DDCSV's 295 message. 296 297 Ad Hoc Committees. Ad hoc committees of DDCSV may be formed from time D. 298 to time to address specific issues or projects if approved by the Steering Committee. 299 Approval of any ad hoc committee budget must come either from the Steering Committee 300 or the general membership. Any significant recommendation or proposal made by an ad 301 hoc committee must first be approved by the Steering Committee. 302 303 E. Committee Meetings. Meetings of committees will be held at such dates, 304 times and places as determined by the membership of each committee. A committee in its 305 discretion may also take action by written consent (including electronic mail) upon 306 agreement by a majority of the committee members. A report of actions taken at a 307 committee meeting shall be provided at the next regular meeting of DDCSV members.

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309	Article XI. Endorsements
310 311	A. <u>DDCSV Endorsements</u> . DDCSV may from time to time endorse Democratic
312	candidates for office or declare a position on a ballot initiative or proposed legislation.
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314	1. Proposals for Endorsement. Any member may propose that DDCSV
315	endorse a candidate for elective office or declare a position on a ballot initiative or proposed
316	legislation. A request for consideration of a candidate shall be referred for review to the
317 318	Endorsement Committee, which shall provide its recommendation at the next meeting of the members.
319	members.
320	2. Member Approval. DDCSV may endorse any eligible candidate or
321	declare a position on any ballot initiative or proposed legislation upon the approval of the
322	members in accordance with Article VI.B. If requested by at least three (3) members,
323 324	voting shall be by secret ballot. Only members in good standing (as defined in Article IV.C
325	above) for not less than three (3) months may vote on a matter of whether to endorse a candidate for elective office or to declare a position on any ballot initiative or proposed
326	legislation.
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328	B. <u>DDCSV Participation in State Party Endorsements</u> . As a chartered Democratic
329 330	club, DDCSV is entitled to participate in pre-endorsing conferences conducted by the
331	California Democratic Party ("CDP") at the regional level, as part of the CDP's multi-step process for endorsing candidates and ballot propositions and initiatives. DDCSV's
332	participation is governed by Article VIII, Section 3g(5)(c) the CDP Central Committee's
333	Bylaws (as amended November 2014), certain elements of which are described below.
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335	1. In the year prior to the pre-endorsing process, a roster of DDCSV
336 337	members in good standing and duly registered as members of the Democratic Party of California as of July 1 of said year shall be submitted to specified county and state party
338	representatives in accordance with applicable party requirements. A "member in good
339	standing" has the meaning set forth in Article IV.C above, and the status of such members
340	included in the roster shall be certified by a Co-Chair, Secretary or Treasurer of DDCSV.
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342 343	2. DDCSV's member representative(s) to a particular pre-endorsing conference shall be from a roster described above. As to those Assembly Districts in which
344	DDCSV members reside (e.g., AD 24, AD 28), DDCSV may designate one representative
345	who is a resident of such Assembly District for each full (not a fraction thereof) 20 members
346	in good standing registered to vote in the Assembly District who were listed on the roster.
347	A DDCSV Co-Chair shall select the representative(s) to the pre-endorsing conference,
348 349	subject to agreement of the member and approval by the Steering Committee at a meeting or by written consent, with the objective of equally apportioning representatives between
350	men and women to the extent possible. As DDCSV members who are also members of
351	other club(s) may only be counted for representation once, the applicable Central
352	Committee Regional Director will assign such members to DDCSV's or another club's roster
353	in accordance with the Central Committee Bylaws.
354 355	Article XII. Dissolution of DDCSV
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357	In the event of a termination or dissolution of the DDCSV, regardless of
358	circumstances, any funds held by the DDCSV after satisfaction of all debts and

- disbursements shall be donated in full to the Santa Clara County Democratic CentralCommittee or in equal parts to its succesor organizations.
